
The Weekly Whim | Block 10: A Thread to Follow

Welcome to The Weekly Whim, a weekly quilt block series stitched one block at a time with scraps, stories, and a gentle focus on becoming.

Today's Block 10, A Thread to Follow, celebrates continuity and the joy of watching familiar fabrics appear again in new ways. We're continuing to use many of the same prints from previous blocks, but this week also welcomes something new: a fabric or two that creeps in from our stash or perhaps from a recent shop visit. It's a good reminder that fresh inspiration often finds its way into the mix when we stay open to it.

In this video, we'll explore fussy cutting, learning how to place prints with purpose to make the most of your fabric's personality. I'll be trying out a ruler I recently rediscovered and comparing it to my usual method using a regular ruler and a few simple helper tools most of us already have.

My Standard Note About Fabric Choices

In this series, I lean into building a scrappy quilt one block at a time. The more fabrics you use (within reason), the more variety you'll have to scatter across future blocks, which helps the finished quilt feel cohesive and "sensical." That said, using fewer fabrics is perfectly acceptable too — choose the balance that feels right for you.

Cutting Instructions (for one block):

- A: (4) 31/2" squares
- B: (4) 2" squares
- · C: (4) 3 1/2" square
 - (4) 2" squares
- D: (1) 3 1/2" square
