

Scrappy Bucket Tote Tutorial

About Tape Width and Tote Size:

Adding machine tape rolls vary in width, and that variation will change the height of your scrappy panels. In turn, this means your tote can be a little taller or shorter, depending on the tape you use.

Consider this your invitation to make it your own.

The one measurement to keep consistent is the **panel width** for the both the outer panel and inner lining pieces, which should accurately measure 16 ½” so they fit the base of the tote correctly. If you choose to use continuous (non-pieced) fabric instead of scrappy panels, simply follow the cutting measurements as written.

You Will Need:

Outer Tote:

Either pieced as shown in the video, or continuous -

- (2) - 13” **wide** x 16 ½” **tall** outer tote panels
- (1) - 12” square of coordinating fabric
- (2) - 5” x 18” strips

Inner Liner:

- (2) - 13” **wide** x 16 ½” **tall** continuous fabric cuts
- (1) - 12” Square of coordinating fabric

Miscellaneous Sewing Supplies:

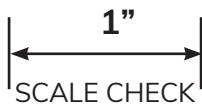
- Sewing Machine
- Sewing Thread (rather than quilting thread, preferably 40 weight or heavier for added durability)
- Fabric Scissors
- Straight/Quilting pins
- Wonder Clips (optional)
