

Summertime Scrappy Season: A Bloom for your Burrow Wallhanging

With the first day of summer so near we can almost taste it - who can think of a better project than a pretty flower for blooming wherever it's planted!

Cutting Instructions:

- (19) - 3" or 3 ¼" squares (flowers)
 - (3) - 3" or 3 ¼" squares (leaves)
 - (22) - 3" or 3 ¼" squares (assorted background)
 - (2) 2 ½" squares (flowers)
 - (2) - 2 ½" squares (leaves)
 - (54) - 2 ½" squares (assorted background)
 - (20) - 2" x 2 ½" rectangles (assorted background)
 - (16) - 1" x 2 ½" rectangles (stems)
 - (15) - 2" squares (grass)
 - (17) - 2" squares (assorted background)
 - (1) - 1 ½" x 16 ½" rectangle (bottom border)
 - (1) - 1 ½" x 16 ½" rectangle (top border)
 - (2) - 1 ½" x 32 ½" rectangles (side borders)
 - (1) - 27" x 41" rectangle, batting
 - (1) - 27" x 41" rectangle, backing
 - ¼ yard - binding
- (you'll need (3) 2 ½" x WOF cuts, attached end to end)

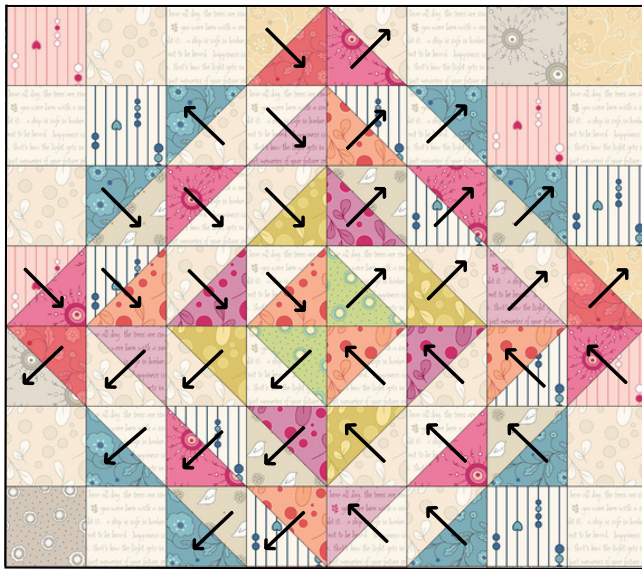

Arrows below indicate which direction to press seam allowances for most half square triangles. For those seams not shown, we'll be covering pressing direction in the video.

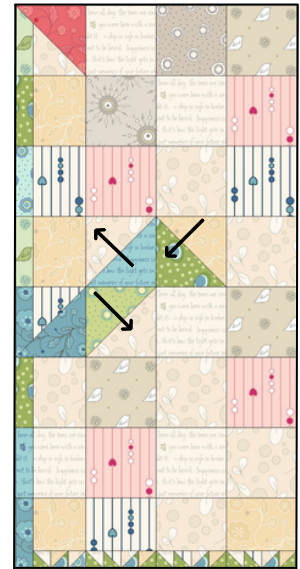
Top Section



Lower Left



Lower Right



***To answer your question:** YES! My instructions for the leaves units in the video are slightly cryptic with respect to their positioning! The illustration above is the intended positioning of the leaves, but of course you are always welcomed to put your leaves just exactly wherever you fancy them!

****ALSO** - In case it wasn't fully clear in the video, you will create the top unit, and each of the two lower units separately, as shown, prior to joining the two lower units side by side, then joining that unit to the top unit. Finally, the top and bottom borders are then added, followed by the left and right borders.
